
REPORTORIONAL SEMENT



OPERATING AREAS



With a journey of 10 years, the Fraternity without Borders coordinates, administers and embraces many operations, mainly in the African continent and in Brazil, where different hearts are welcomed, lives are transformed and people all over the world come together in the fraternity.

Among our areas of operation, we consider that there are direct and indirect operations. The direct ones are those that have a specific project in a specific location in the world, and that receive sponsorship via the FWB. There are currently 10 projects in this setup, in Brazil and Africa. The indirect ones cover some particular activities that we help with other donations received, as happens in Haiti and happened in Venezuela, and that is why they also appear in our financial report.

DIRECT AREAS OF OPERATION

In Mozambique / Africa, our first project, Shelter Mozambique, continues to gain force and welcoming children and the elderly in extreme social vulnerability, and today serves more than 11,000 people. In Madagascar / Africa, one of the places with the most needs, we have already welcomed 3,500 people in the project Madagascar Action and we are trying to expand our services by providing education, health and food. In Senegal / Africa, with Chemin du Futur, our boys receive education, food, housing and the opportunity of a different and full of possibilities future. In Malawi / Africa, we work alongside the refugee camp, Dzaleka, which today has more than 29,000 war refugees from some countries also from Africa, mainly from the Democratic Republic of Congo. There, in the Ubuntu Nation, we built schools and invested in the education of children who would not have the opportunity to study.



OPERATING AREAS

In Brazil, we support the project of Dr. Adriana Melo, 'Love without Dimensions', which serves children with microcephaly in Campina Grande / PB, Belo Horizonte / MG and Maceió / AL, providing all the support regarding treatment, such as physiotherapy. In Caculé / BA, we embrace the Aline Teixeira project, 'Garden of Butterflies', which serves and supports children who suffer from a rare disease called Epidermolysis Bullosa (EB). Also in Bahia, more specifically in the Bahian hinterland, in Retirolândia, we embrace the 'Portraits of Hope' project, which builds houses and offers workshops and tutoring for families in extreme social vulnerability. In Boa Vista, Roraima, we created the project 'BRAZIL, A SHELTERING HEART', intending to welcome and provide new horizons to Venezuelan immigrants who arrive in Brazil, daily, in search of a new life.

In Campo Grande, Mato Grosso do Sul, we embraced the 'Young Philharmonic Orchestra Emmanuel', which, through music, seeks a new outlook for young people from the outskirts of the city. Still in the capital of Mato Grosso do Sul, in partnership with 'Clinic of the Soul', we have 'Fraternity in the Street', created specifically for the treatment of drug addicts, providing a chance for a restart and cure for those who cannot afford private treatment.

INDIRECT AREAS OF OPERATION

In Haiti, we support 200 children with food at the Gnosis school, located in the city of Hinche. In Venezuela, the aid was punctual in Caracas, until April 2019, contributing with a group of volunteers who distribute food to families in extreme poverty.

In Senegal, Malawi, Madagascar, Mozambique, Campina Grande (PB), Boa Vista (RR), Campo Grande (MS), Caculé (BA), Retirolândia (BA), Haiti or Venezuela ... we are tireless to feel gratitude for all this!



A fraternal movement will always be a story written by many hands. Fraternity without Borders (FWB) was born from the heart of a man, but it reached and helps more people every day through the union of various fraternal hearts.

Wagner Moura Gomes, the founder and president of the FWB, was just a boy when he found himself crying for the hunger in the world. A pain that accompanied him throughout his youth, when he was already dedicated to volunteer work on the outskirts of Campo Grande (MS), his hometown. As an adult, unable to avoid this call, he decided to go to Africa.

He picked Mozambique, a Portuguese-speaking country, located in the poorest region of the world, Sub-Saharan Africa. There began the Fraternity without Borders' work of welcoming, which today has already expanded into all areas of activity presented.

From those early days to today, a series of happy events, sponsors and friends of the cause, weave this story of fraternity.



AWARDS

In 2019, the founder-president, Wagner Moura Gomes, received a tribute at the "Prêmio Inspiração" (Inspiring Award) on the Globo TV program Caldeirão do Huck. And yet, Fraternity without Borders received a Human Rights Award from the City Council of Campo Grande(MS).

SHELTER MOZAMBIQUE

The reality that took us to Mozambique, our first project, is what we try to change daily. In Mozambican villages, 1 million people suffer from hunger and drink dirty water. Most are orphaned children, whose parents died of HIV and malaria, who work in exchange for a meal and do not go to school.

People go up to three days without a meal and walk miles to get 20 litres of non-potable water. For 10 years, we have fought together to change this reality. Today, we are already present in 30 villages with our community centers, providing food, school reinforcement and workshops for thousands of people - including children, adults and the elderly.

With years of work, we can see beautiful fruits. Our young people have studied more and are starting to enter into college, a reality hitherto unknown to many. We drill wells, build houses and bring health through our humanitarian missions. We encourage local culture with music and art workshops and invest in bio-charcoal, agroforestry, sewing and various activities to provide independence and dignity.

ACT MADAGASCAR

The south of the Madagascar island, more precisely the city of Ambovombe, is experiencing one of the worst humanitarian crises in the world. Without access to water, children bathe only when it rains and half of them have severe malnutrition. Families live in very precarious homes, and the lack of hygiene and severe malnutrition lead to diseases such as teniasis, neurocysticercosis, chigger and others.

Right at the beginning, between 2017 and 2018, we welcomed approximately 3 thousand people, offering food, clean water and hygiene care. We registered 357 children in the school and together, volunteers, sponsors and supporters, we built the City of Fraternity, an area with 100 houses that were donated to the neediest families in the region. Within the City of Fraternity, we implemented agroforestry, bio-charcoal and excavated a well with drinking water.

CITY OF FRATERNITY • 100 WELCOMED FAMILIES • 134 EMPLOYEES 357 CHILDREN ENROLLED IN SCHOOLS

Between the years 2018 and 2019, a Brazilian doctor went to live there to attend daily the countless cases of malnourished children. Malnutrition and diarrhea are the main causes of child death in the country. Our humanitarian missions are most of the time exclusive to the health area, due to the need in the region.

Today we succeeded to set up a nutritional center, to provide dental care and to buy our own land, where we will build our community center and clinics.

UBUNTU NATION

The Ubuntu Nation project in Malawi was born out of the need to welcome those who do not have a "nation". The project aims to promote health and education for thousands of war refugees who are in the area, more precisely in the Dzaleka refugee camp, coming from various countries facing a terrible civil war.

In Dzaleka, there are more than 39,000 refugees, among them, more than 9,000 are children who do not attend school because they are not allowed to leave the camp, not even to register their children in school.

Thus, we implemented our community center next to the field, with the objective of assisting these people. In 2019, we built 10 classrooms and took the teachers, Lilian and Gabriel Vogt, to create an entire educational system, select professionals and provide training. The school initially serves around 300 children, 90% refugees and 10% Malawians in extreme vulnerability. We built rooms for workshops such as dance, sewing and more, and we also invested in the construction of a cafeteria for children.

BRAZIL, A SHELTERING HEART

The project 'Brazil, a sheltering heart' was born out of a reflection: when an immigration crisis knocks on the door, we have two choices - either we close borders or we open our hearts.

We chose to open our hearts and welcome the Venezuelan refugees entering Brazil, through Boa Vista (RR). We implemented a community center, in which we prioritize families with children and the elderly who arrive in Brazil and have nowhere to take shelter.

Our movement gained strength when countless volunteers embraced the cause and helped us start the process that we call interiorization. Volunteers made themselves available to pay financially for travel and accommodation costs as well as providing jobs and time to embrace and help these families to start over with hope and unity.

236 INTERIORIZED VENEZUELANS IN 2019

Two hundred and thirty-six Venezuelans were settled in Brazil in 2019, through this project. Many beautiful stories of new beginnings and connections have been lived and shared. But the matter does not stop. Every day families continue to cross the borders yearning for a fresh start. A new beginning, which we know that together we can afford. Let's continue!

CHEMIM DU FUTUR

The Fraternity without Borders (FWB) embraced the Chemin Du Futur project in 2016 with the aim of advancing to help street children in Dakar, Senegal. It is estimated that at least 30,000 boys do not have a home across the region. According to the UN, this is the biggest phenomenon of street children in the world.

To help change the lives of these young people, a group of volunteers set up the Chemin du Futur orphanage (Way to the Future), a home that offers affection and education. After the support of the FWB, the orphanage started to be maintained by the sponsors who contribute monthly to the cause and enable assistance in the social, medical and school reinforcement areas.

> NOW WE HAVE: - 1 BAKERY - 1 READING ROOM - 1 COMPUTER ROOM

In 2019, we opened the bakery that produces bread for the orphanage and for local businesses, providing a job and an income for the older boys who have been in the project for the longest time. The routine is one of discipline and, in addition to school and health care, it includes music, sports and job training. Last year, the reading room was also inaugurated as an incentive to study and a computer lab with computers and equipment that will provide young people with a valuable learning experience in professional preparation.

PORTRAITS OF HOPE

Photography that changes realities. This is the basis of this project supported by the Fraternity Without Borders since 2018. Portraits of Hope operates in one of the poorest regions of Brazil, the remote areas of the state of Bahia, offering, with the help from volunteers, housing for families living in extreme poverty circumstances, in addition to school tutoring, psychological assistance, music, computer and Spanish classes, taught by Venezuelans.

It was photographing for a long time the local tough reality that Bismark Araújo managed to raise funds and act on behalf of these families. Now, together, with a little bit of each one, we dream to take there more education, clean water and basic sanitation.

10 HOUSES BUILT IN FOUR CITIES 1 ARTESIAN WELL

In March 2019, the first humanitarian mission to the countryside of Bahia was held, where health care was provided and a beautiful immersion in the culture of the Brazilian northeast. Then, the construction of Vila da Esperança began - a set of houses delivered to families living in extreme poverty. We know that together we can still do more for our Bahia.

GARDEN OF BUTTERFLIES

The mission of the NGO Garden of Butterflies is to care for children who endure from a rare disease called Epidermolysis Bullosa (EB). Affectionately called "butterflies", children receive this name due to the similarity between their fragile skin and the fragility as a whole of butterflies. The disease that affects the skin is serious, not contagious and incurable, leaving sensitive wounds even to water. The Fraternity without Borders supports this initiative to help maintain this work of love and hope.

60 CHILDREN WELCOMED FOR TREATMENT AND SOCIAL ASSISTANCE

Today, sponsorship provides these children with the chance of a better life condition, through the purchase of expensive medicines and dressings. A box of silicone dressing indicated for treatment costs in Brazil about R\$ 2,250 and in the United States, US\$ 119. On average, a child uses one box per day, thus totalling 30 boxes per month, about R\$ 67,500. Apart from medication, children need clothes and a better quality of life in terms of housing.

And that is why we come together for these children. We want to provide all these butterflies with the best possible life, full of care, smiles, love and faith that better days are ahead.

MICROCEPHALY, LOVE WITHOUT DIMENSIONS

A project that was born from research and welcomed in action. Dr. Adriana Melo, responsible for discovering the relationship between the Zika virus and microcephaly, created the project by discovering that the sooner treatment is started, the more chance the child has to have a life with very few limitations. A work that unites science and love, in Campina Grande, Paraíba. Children receive the treatment they need at the Center for Comprehensive Care of Children with Microcephaly, from the Professor Joaquim Amorim Neto Research Institute (Ipesq).



A multidisciplinary team made up of physiotherapists, psychologists, doctors, assist the children, offering the families a chance of adequate treatment. The Fraternity without Borders supported the cause and today it helps the project to move forward and treat more children every day. In 2019, Porto Esperança, one of the project's centers, was opened in Belo Horizonte (MG) - an extension of the Professor Joaquim Amorim Neto Research Institute (Ipesq). The house is a partnership between Love without Dimensions and Fraternity without Borders.

FRATERNITY IN THE STREET

This work by Clínica da Alma, in partnership with the Fraternity without Borders, aims to welcome, love, persevere and have faith. The goal is to rescue from the streets of Campo Grande (MS) drug-addicted people who want to quit their addiction, thus rewriting a new story for their lives through love and hope.

The treatment offered by the clinic is entirely free and is possible thanks to the effort and perseverance of the volunteers and sponsors of the cause. The project operates on the faith through prayer and seeks to use the method of occupational therapy, in which residents work to occupy the mind and feel active and useful.



YOUNG EMMANUEL PHILHARMONIC ORCHESTRA

This project is based on music education as a source of appreciation for life. The use of music to change the lives of girls and boys from the outskirts of Campo Grande (MS). The conductor Orion Cruz leads this orchestra, which represents discipline and focus for many young people.

4 TEACHERS 1 SUPERVISOR 52 STUDENTS

The classes take place at sites of the project partners, twice a week. As young people evolve, they become part of the Youth Philharmonic Orchestra Emmanuel. Contact with music awakens new values and often transforms the relationships with school, family and friends.

The instruments already part of the project are: violin, classical viola, cello, double bass, transverse and baroque flutes, and clarinet. There are four teachers, a supervisor and 52 students.

Events and Actions

In 2019, the FWB and the volunteer force carried out more than 90 initiatives, including events and actions. Among them, we must disclose the III FWB Meeting that brought together, in April 2019, 3,000 people at Mineirão Stadium, in Belo Horizonte (MG).

In addition, to celebrate the 10 years of Fraternidade sem Fronteiras, completed on November 15, 2019, we created the World Fraternity without Borders Day, which featured more than 50 fraternal actions, from volunteers, carried out on the same day, simultaneously in 10 countries, spreading the message and celebrating the moment together.

HUMANITARIAN MISSIONS



We value transparency and, above all, the encouragement and experience of fraternity. And that is why everyone who contributes to this movement can see the work up close.

The humanitarian missions make it possible for sponsors to experience the reality they help to change with their donations, actions and initiatives. It is also because of this proximity that we managed to form a network of volunteers so engaged and involved with the cause.

In our humanitarian missions, we take, through our sponsors, medicines, clothes, food and especially health care, which is very precarious everywhere we operate. Through them, each volunteer gets to know the local reality up close and connects with those welcomed in a unique and deep-felt way.

In 2019, we held 30 humanitarian missions, with 546 participants, to the projects: Madagascar Action, Sheltering Mozambique, Ubuntu Nation, Fraternity in the street; and yet, we had some carried out by the supported projects Portraits of Hope and Chemin du Futur.






ANNUAL INCOME










TRANSFERS TO SUPPORTED INTERNATIONAL PROJECTS




TRANSFERS TO SUPPORTED BRAZILIAN AND INTERNATIONAL FWB PROJECTS






MICROCEPHALY - CAMPINA GRANDE (PB)




ORCHESTRA - CAMPO GRANDE (MS)




